Thank you to our nurse participants! We completed data collection for our formative evaluation of an eLearning training in suicide safety planning in February and are now analyzing the data and preparing a manuscript for publication.


Number of nurses who completed the study phases



Making an impact

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Over half (57%) of our nurses who completed the training reported making at least one change in how they interact with patients experiencing suicidality because of the training, such as "talking more with patients on my unit about suicidal thoughts than I previously have".

C-SSRS Suicide Risk Screening Study

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Thank you to our nurse participants! Data collection is complete and analysis is underway for our study funded by the Department of Psychiatry and in partnership with Data QUEST at ITHS: <u>Suicide Risk Screening in Acute</u> and Intensive Care at a Level 1 Trauma Center!

We collected electronic health record data on suicide risk screening for over 10,500 patients receiving inpatient care for medical, surgical, or traumatic injury reasons at Harborview and talked with 22 acute and intensive care nurses about their experiences with the screening.

This summer we welcome two UW undergraduate research practicum students who will help analyze our focus group data.

Project WISE collaborators are leading two new research centers focused on suicide prevention and treatment, funded by the National Institute of Mental Health.

- ★ <u>Katherine Ann Comtois, PhD, MPH</u> will direct the new <u>UW</u> <u>Suicide Care Research Center</u>. Dr. Darnell will co-lead the Center's program to support interdisciplinary research teams new to suicide care research in pilot projects.
- ★ Edwin D. Boudreaux, PhD will direct the Center for Accelerating Practices to End Suicide through Technology Translation (CAPES), which will bridge the research-to-practice gap among empirically supported technologies enabling suicide risk identification, monitoring, and prevention in healthcare settings.
